## ArSRT Ken Baltz Radiologic Technologist Scholarship Application

The ArSRT Ken Baltz Radiologic Technologist Scholarship is a one-time \$250 award that is provided to an eligible ArSRT radiologic technologist member. Members interested in receiving this award should review the posted eligibility criteria and apply via the ArSRT website (<a href="www.arsrt.org">www.arsrt.org</a>) by February 1st. Winners will be awarded at the annual meeting.

## **RT Eligibility:**

- 1. ARRT registered technologist
- 2. Have and carry a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.\*
- 3. Have worked in the medical imaging clinical or didactic setting for at least one year (as a registered or student technologist).
- 4. Be pursuing a degree in higher education: bachelor, master, specialist, or doctoral degree.
- 5. The recipient of this scholarship must maintain a minimum load of 6 credit hours per semester for the academic year.
- 6. Must be a member of ArSRT, but not a current member of the Board\*.
  - (\*A Board member may apply if there are no other applicants for the designated year. Board member applications must be received Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1<sup>st</sup>. All eligibility and application process requirements still apply.)
- 7. Has not received this award within the past 3 years.

## **RT Application Process**

RTs must submit:

- 1. A completed copy of the ArSRT scholarship application.
- 2. Copy of current ARRT card.
- 3. Current vitae showing professional experience (employer and dates of employment)
- 4. Verification of enrollment in higher education courses (course schedule or letter from advisor).
- 5. An essay discussing the points stipulated by the scholarship committee.
  - a. The essay must be original (in the applicant's own words).
  - b. The essay will be typed, with a minimum of 3 pages and a maximum of 5 pages.
    - i. Times New Roman
    - ii. Size 12 font
    - iii. Double spaced
  - c. The essay may NOT contain any personal information within the essay that could be used by readers to identify the applicant. For example, do NOT cite:
    - i. Your name or age
    - ii. Your current employment
  - d. The essay must discuss the following points:
    - i. Explanation of why applicant is pursuing the degree.
    - ii. Explanation of how this degree will help you with your future goals.
    - iii. Your planned professional contribution(s) to the field in the future.
